It has to be more than babysitting, and we must be willing to invest our time, money and resources to reaching families."

22% of clergy in charge of a congregation said balancing the demands of ministry is among the most significant personal obstacles they face.

19% of clergy in charge of a congregation said a lack of parish financial resources was among the most significant personal obstacles they face.

18% of clergy in charge of a congregation felt that a deficiency in their leadership ability was a significant personal obstacle.

"I need some clergy help, but cannot afford to hire anyone full-time, so few takers."

"I have so much on my plate that at times I'm the blockage/hindrance in the system. So I'm trying to compensate by 'doing it myself' instead of raising up a team which would be better by far."
