Opening thought: "(Romans 8:11) In other words, it is the Spirit who reproduces in us the crucifixion and the resurrection of our Lord. The old unregenerate 'I' is nailed to the cross with Christ (Gal. 2:20): we 'live in the Spirit' or walk in the Spirit' precisely in so far as we allow the Spirit to 'crucify' the flesh with its affections and lusts' (Gal. 5:24). And equally it is the Spirit who liberates Christ's risen power in us and enables us to share in his triumph. So 'walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lusts of the flesh' (Gal. 5:16)." - Michael Green, I Believe in the Holy Spirit (pages 108-109)
